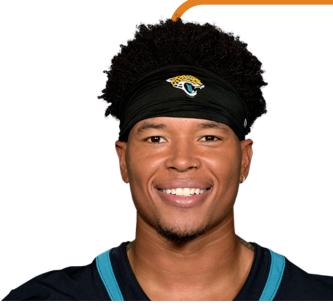
QB Matthew Stafford

Jared Goff threw the 4th most passing yards and 6th most TDs in the NFL in 2018, followed by the 3rd most passing yards in 2019. Imagine what a talent like Stafford can do - at a resonable QB12 price.



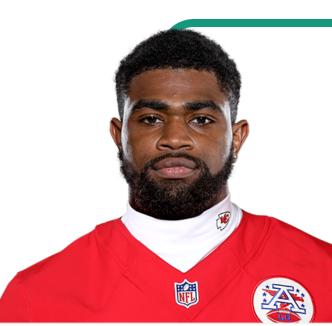
WR Will Fuller

Last year's WR8 in fppg is being drafted as this year's WR42 - why? The public is fearful of Fuller's fit with Tua, but a drop in aDOT led to a career year for Fuller in 2020. He is Miami's best offensive player.



WR Marvin Jones

It baffles me that Marvin Jones, a player who was prioritized by JAX and plays amongst the biggest at his position across the league, is being selected as the distant 3rd WR on his own team. He is the No. 1



RB Clyde Edwards-Helaire

A top 7 RB season exists for CEH. A jump to 60-70 receptions in KC's screen game is possible, and the OL improvement should offer far more rushing wrinkles to the NFL's most bankable offense.



WR Nelson Agholor

Rarely can you land a team's top WR at a WR62 price tag. The Patriots will lead the NFL in two TE sets, but Agholor will be on the field for every snap. He averaged over 10 ppg in this format last season.



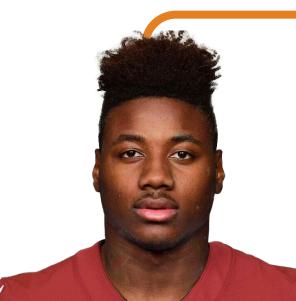
QB Matt Ryan

The significance of Arthur Smith calling plays for this offense cannot be overstated. Atlanta ranked 26th in redzone TD rate over the last two seasons. Arthur Smith's Titans? 1st and 2nd. Wizardy.



RB Mike Davis

Continuing the point from above, even a jump into the top 10 in redzone TD rate would be HUGE for all pieces. TDs over FGs. Namely Davis, who is the only RB with any kind of investment to his name.



WR Curtis Samuel

Samuel's true breakout season was in 2019 with Norv and Scott Turner when he spent 70% of his snaps out wide and only missed 10+ TDs due to Kyle Allen's arm. His WR49 ADP is an easy smash.





TE Mike Gesicki

No player needs their ADP reset more than Gesicki. Last yéar's TE7 in ppg played 67% of his snaps in the slot last season - an area that will now be occupied by 6th overall pick Jaylen Waddle. Where does he fit?



WR Brandin Cooks

Houston might produce the worst offensive output of any team in the last 5 years by averaging 14 points a game. Despite his round 8 ADP, Cooks will be a spiked week player. Just draft MVS 60 spots later.



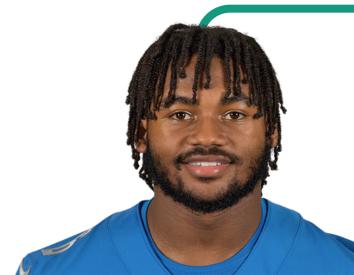
QB Joe Burrow

This isn't an anti-Burrow take - I really like selecting the QB attached to three strong WRs, a pass forward playcaller and a great RB... just not ahead of Brady, Stafford and Rodgers... which Burrow is now.



WR Tee Higgins

Few, if any, rookie WRs have ever been selected higher than Ja'Marr Chase at WR22. Boyd will continue to dominate slot opportunities. I question if enough will be left for Higgins to hit at WR24.



RB D'Andre Swift

You cannot convince me that a RB in a split backfield, on likely one of the worst offenses in the NFL, should be selected as the 16th player at his position.



TE T.J. Hockenson

Hock should lead DET in targets, but on a team with a proj win total of 4.5, the range of outcomes is vast. This is far from the near perfect situation Goff played in for years. I can't trust a single Lion.



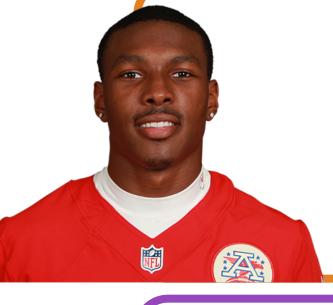
WR Laviska Shenault

Marvin Jones was brought in to play. Viska is definitely talented, but do we even know the role he will fill on this team? I will select Mike Williams, Will Fuller and Curtis Samuel over Viska every time.



RB Saquon Barkley

It is impossible to doubt Saquon's pure talent. It is worthwhile to question his Week 1 role. Barkley and the team have been cagey about his injury timeline. I'm avoiding that question in the top 10.



WR Mecole Hardman

In selecting Hardman as a top 50 WR, you are banking on a player totally transforming his game. Showing skills we have not seen through 3 seasons. Even KC did not trust him in critical spots last year.



QB Jalen Hurts

If Hurts starts 17 games, he will put up points. But his QB8 ADP is rushing production FOMO. Even the Eagles are not sold on Hurts, so why is he being drafted over Brady, Rodgers, Stafford & others?



RB Alexander Mattison

A discounted premiere insurance RB, Mattison is attached to a balanced offense with a decent OL, has a career 4.6 YPC, and finished 5th in elusiveness in 2020. Ignore his one-game bust.



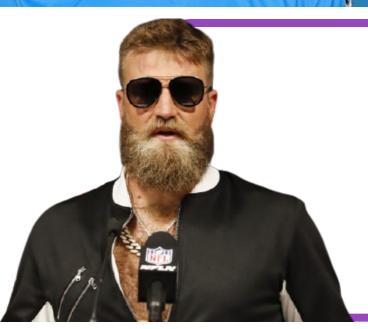
WR Cole Beasley

The No. 2 WR in the NFL's most pass-heavy offense, Beasley was the WR37 per game last year. He's cheaper now after threatening to retire, but I'm not believing that with BUF in the SB hunt.



TE T.J. Hockenson

The Lions are missing 360 targets from last year's roster, by far the highest available targets in the NFL. Hockenson will have top-5 TE volume and he has the talent to maximize despite Goff.



QB Ryan Fitzpatrick

Since 2018, he is 18th in fantasy points, 4th in success rate, and 9th in YPA among 45 QBs. McLaurin, Samuel, and Gibson are a good enough skill group to support FitzMagic's QB2 appeal.



WR Robert Woods

This is a Round 4 bet on the Rams offense with Stafford. Woods was the WR16 per game on WR13 fantasy usage last year despite the Rams finishing No. 22 in scoring. He's always slept on.



WR Chase Claypool

My eyes and his per-route efficiency tell me he's the Steelers best WR. He was 7th in YPRR vs. man coverage as a rookie and has 99th percentile size-adjusted speed. PIT will throw deeper in '21.



WR Corey Davis

A former top-10 pick, Davis finally broke out in '20 after dominating in 2-WR sets. The Jets' offense is identical to that Titans' scheme, and Davis has \$27M reasons why he'll be heavily involved now.



RB Austin Ekeler

While playing injured behind a worse OL with a worse coaching staff, Ekeler was the RB13 per game in Half PPR on RB13 fantasy usage. He's OC Joe Lombardi's version of Alvin Kamara.



TE Hunter Henry

Belichick gave Henry top-5 TE money in FA, and he profiles as the every-down TE between him and the slightly smaller Jonnu Smith. Henry was the TE12 per game last year but is the TE19 in ADP.



WR Mike Williams

People are tired of Mike Will, which has made him a post-hype value. The former 1st-rounder has a QB with a rocket arm and now has the OL & HC to maximize the offense. Top-25 WR potential.

HAYDEN WINKS' 10 PLAYERS TO AVOID



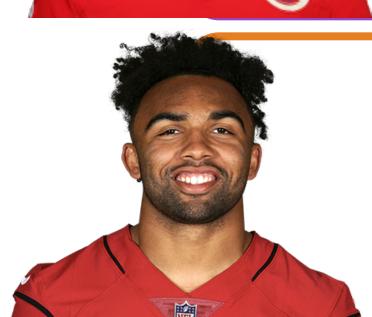
RB Derrick Henry

No receiving role, thus being drafted (1.04) at his ceiling despite coming off seasons with 397 and 321 touches. New OC Todd Downing's only year as an NFL OC resulted in the No. 23 offense.



QB Patrick Mahomes

He had a breakeven best ball win rate last year despite being the QB1 overall per game because he's too expensive. I'd rather have an every-week RB or WR in Round 4 than an elite QB.



WR Christian Kirk

Only the WR51 per game last year, Kirk's ceiling is capped with A.J. Green (\$6M) and Rondale Moore (2nd round) now involved. Kirk will likely rotate in 3-WR sets after playing most snaps in 2020.



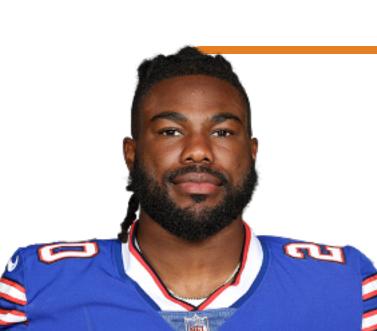
WR DeVante Parker

The WR43 per game last year now faces legit target competition from Will Fuller (\$11M) and Jaylen Waddle (1st round), and we aren't sure if Tua Tagovailoa is going to be a good NFL passer.



WR Gabriel Davis

He will play in 4-WR sets, but I think Emmanuel Sanders and Cole Beasley will run more routes in 3-WR sets after watching Davis' film. He has non-starting caliber lateral mobility on in/out routes.



RB Zack Moss

The Bills will be top-5 in neutral pass rate, and they're too deep at WR to throw to their RBs often. That's why they were 31st in RB fantasy usage last year. Moss & Singletary form a RBBC.



WR D.J. Chark

Chark's deep route monopoly is threatened by OC Bevell's buddy Marvin Jones. Add in Shenault & Etienne, and I get nervous about his WR34 ADP. He was the WR68 in YPRR vs. man coverage last year.



WR Jalen Reagor

He looked tight on tape and finished 93rd out of 97 WRs in YPRR vs. man coverage as a rookie. He has an uphill battle with a bad passing QB and a Heisman winning WR teammate.



RB Michael Carter

I'm a believer in his skills, but the 22-year-old is currently third in line for RB snaps. I'm worried that he'll be a low-volume player at 5'8/201. 8-12 touches per game won't be enough in half PPR.



TE Evan Engram

The TE17 per game in Half PPR last year, Engram faces more target competition this season from Kyle Rudolph, Kenny Golladay, Kadarius Toney, and Saquon Barkley. Too many mouths for NYG.

IDEAL DRAFT

The gap between 2020's TE1 (Kelce) and the TE3 was 110 fantasy points nearly 7 per game. Locking in that TE edge in round one might feel odd, but Harris, CEH, Mixon or other anchor RBs will be available in round 2.

Rounds 3 - 7 are the sweet spot for WRs, so take advantage since you are likely starting four each week. And don't be afraid to select WRs on the same team! Both can have big years.

Nailing 4 WRs, at least, before round 8 is imperative. After that, Harris is extremely appealing due to volume behind a great OL. Freely draft another WR or upside RB after.

If you drafted 3 RBs in the top 8 rounds, stop and focus on other positions. Instead stock up on WRs who have proven volume, yet are still overlooked

Rarely will picks in rounds 13-18 greatly contribute to the outcome of your season. The most likely to help? A QB2, RB insurance or an unexpected breakout player stacked with your QB.

WHATIS BEST BALL?

RULE #1

DRAFT ONLY

Instead of worrying about time-consuming waivers like you do in season-long fantasy leagues, best ball leagues are all about the draft. That means we can enter as many contests as possible leading up to the season without worrying about being exhausted by actually managing each roster.

RULE #2

BEST LINEUP IS SET WEEKLY

There is no setting rosters after the draft is completed. Whoever scores the most points on your roster each week will be automatically placed into the "starting lineup", which consists of 1 QB, 2 RB, 3 WR, 1 TE, and 1 FLEX (RB, WR, or TE) on Underdog Fantasy. The season-long standings are determined by total points.

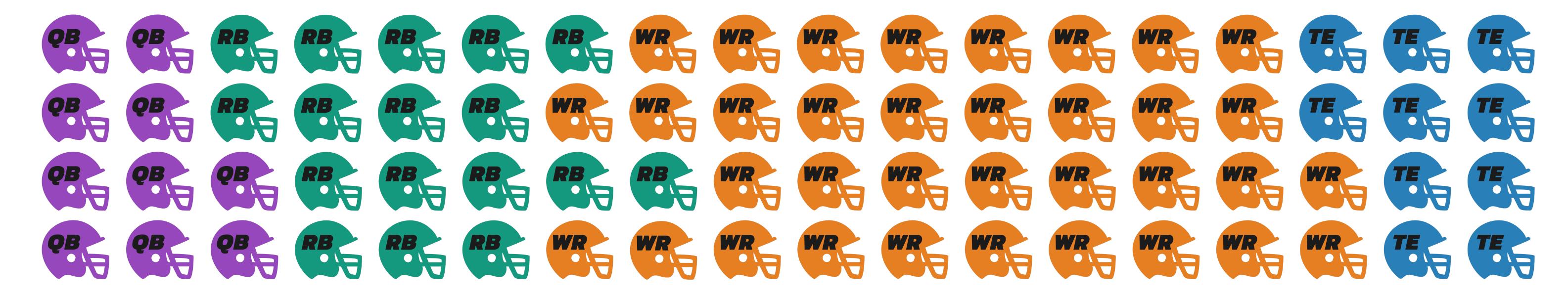

BEST BALL TIPS

TIP #1

1. Understand "Roster construction"

Because we can't make pickups or trades after the draft, we must pay attention to how many players we draft at each position. My research suggests there are plenty of different options, but the basics are between 2-3 QBs, 3-6 RBs, 8-10 WRs, and 2-3 TEs. If we spend multiple early-round picks on RBs, then we might only draft 4 RBs total. But if we only have 1 early-round RB, then we should aim for 5-6 RBs. TIP #2

Don't overreach on players. The wisdom of the crowd is a valuable baseline, and drafting a player too early limits the upside of your roster. In best ball tournaments, somebody will have drafted a very similar team to yours but drafted them at better values if you do pull the trigger early. There's always the next draft if you miss out on "your guy" by a few picks.

TIP #3

3. STACK YOUR ROSTER

Drafting players from the same real-life team adds correlation to your roster. If you've drafted a receiver in the second round, then you've already committeed that his quarterback will be decent, too, so we might as well draft his quarterback later on. People who had two different triple stacks (at least 3 players from the same team) in the inaugural Best Ball Mania tournament in 2020 had the best odds of winning their league.

TIP #4
